7th and 8th Grade Choir Syllabus

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Course Goals:

- The student will demonstrate proper posture and breathing techniques to support vocal production.
- The student will sing with a free and clear tone, using accurate intonation and purity of vowels and clarity
 of consonants.
- The student will perform dynamics and tempos as indicated by markings in the score in both solo and ensemble singing
- The student will perform an assigned vocal part in unison and in simple harmony.
- The student will respond to basic conducting gestures.
- The student will read and write basic music notation.
- The student will demonstrate an awareness of the collaborative nature of the choral art demonstrating an by demonstrating concert etiquette as a performer and listener.

Text and Materials:

- Each student should bring a notebook and pencil for notes
- Music will be provided in class

Course Outline:

1st Nine Weeks

- Breathing techniques and exercises
- Work on simple solfeggio singing and rhythm patterns from notation
- Sing songs to reinforce the five pure vowel sounds
- Sing rounds and easy two part songs
- Prepare music for Veterans Day performance
- Prepare All District tryout music
- Prepare music for a possible performance at the end of the grading period

2nd Nine Weeks

- Continue working on breathing exercises, proper vowel and consonant sounds, solfeggio and rhythm work from notation
- Continue preparing for All District tryout music
- Prepare music for the Christmas Concert
- Prepare music for a spring musical
- Continue work on part singing (including rounds, cannons, two and three part songs)

3rd and 4th Nine Weeks

- Continue working on breathing exercises, proper vowel and consonant sounds, solfeggio and rhythm work from notation while constantly increasing the level of difficulty
- Continue working on music for a spring musical
- Prepare music for a Spring Concert
- Continue work on part singing (including rounds, cannons, two, three, and four part songs)

Grading Policy:

 Nine weekly grades will be averaged with test grades and performance grades (tests and performance grades will be multiplied by two before averaging).
